#### WHO CAN APPLY?

- Second and third year undergraduate students at Duke who have demonstrated an interest in global health through coursework
- Previous international or community-based project experience is desirable

#### REQUIREMENTS

Students are expected to make a significant commitment to preparing for their experience. This includes readings and background research, as well as attending:

- Bi-weekly meetings with faculty directors
- Pre-departure workshops focused on project development and implementation
- Post-fieldwork workshops focused on reentry and processing the experience
- Public presentations of the experience

The DGHI Student Research Training Program is an intensive experiential learning program that engages second and third year undergraduate students in the development, implementation and assessment of a community-based project.
