What is Global Health?

Global health is an area for study, research, and practice that places priority on improving health and achieving equity in health for all people worldwide. Global health emphasizes transnational health issues, determinants, and solutions; involves many disciplines within and beyond the health sciences and promotes interdisciplinary collaboration; and is a synthesis of population-based prevention with individual-level clinical care.

Major in Global Health

The major in global health must be combined with any other major at Duke to create your one-of-a-kind education experience.

MAJOR REQUIREMENTS*

3 core courses

- Fundamentals of Global Health
- Pre-approved Global Health Ethics course (Must be taken prior to ELA)
- Research Methods in Global Health

3 foundation courses

3 elective courses

Choose 3 courses from a list of pre-approved Global Health courses and related electives

1 statistics course

Choose from a pre-approved list

1 senior seminar

Global Health Capstone

1 experiential activity

MINOR REQUIREMENTS*

2 core courses

- Fundamentals of Global Health
- Pre-approved Global Health Ethics course

3 Electives

Cross-listed courses and up to 2 transfer credits are acceptable. Courses taken satisfactory/unsatisfactory and Advanced Placement credits do not count.
