TEACHING RECORD

Courses Taught at Duke University

GLHLTH 101.01 Fundamentals of Global Health (3 credits)

Fundamentals of Global Health is a course that surveys global health issues facing the world today. Students will examine the history of global health, global health governance, global burden of disease, global health ethics, global health disparities and inequities, and global health research, practice, and advocacy. They will use key concepts, tools, and frameworks - such as biosocial perspectives and political ecology - to inform their analysis of case studies in Indigenous health; infectious diseases; climate and health; sexual and reproductive health; non-communicable diseases; violence and injury; disasters and humanitarian crises; mental health. Spring 2025 (75 enrolled); Spring 2026 (100 enrolled)

GLHLTH 772.01 Global Health Research: Qualitative Field Methods

This graduate level course builds on material from GLHLTH 702 and is a field-based, applied course designed to help students expand their knowledge and skills for qualitative global health research. Students will learn the fundamentals of qualitative research and ethics, selecting qualitative data collection tools, gathering different types of qualitative data, analyzing data using low- and high-tech tools, and presenting findings for different audiences They will practice individual and group interviewing skills, arts-based data collection, ethnographic methods, participatory mapping, and collaborative data collection and analysis strategies. The emphasis is on applied qualitative research skills commonly used in global health projects. Spring 2025 (25 enrolled); Spring 2026 (14 enrolled)

GLHLTH 571.01 Global Maternal and Child Health (3 credits)

This course focuses on the health and well-being of childbearing people and infants and young children (birth to 5 years) using critical biocultural, life course, and intergenerational perspectives. Students will examine the unique health challenges facing this population globally, at the intersections of climate justice and reproductive justice. They will learn about initiatives for research, practice, and policy informed by lived experiences, Indigenous knowledge, and a commitment to health equity and human rights. This course provides a solid foundation in global perspectives on maternal and child health research, practice, and policy. Students will utilize published research reports and case studies to examine critical health challenges facing women, children, providers, and policymakers in some of the world's most vulnerable communities. No prerequisites. Fall 2024 (31 enrolled); Fall 2025 (34 enrolled)

GLHLTH 701.01 Global Health Challenges (3 credits)

Global Health Challenges is a graduate seminar that focuses on major global health problems facing the world today. Using political economy and political ecology as frameworks for understanding global health challenges and solutions, students will learn the metrics, determinants, key issues, systems and actors, and intervention models used in global health research and practice. The course features lectures and case studies that are used to help students analyze key areas contributing to the

global burden of disease: infectious disease; communicable diseases; maternal, reproductive, and child health; and injury, violence, and disasters. Throughout the course, emphasis is placed on both understanding the complex interaction of upstream and downstream approaches to improve health outcomes and elucidating successful strategies in reducing health disparities and inequities. Open to graduate and professional students only. Required core course for the Duke Global Health Certificate. No prerequisites. Spring 2024 – (18 enrolled); Spring 2026 (31 enrolled)

GLHLTH 700.01 Global Health Field Research: Planning and Skill Development (1credit)

The goal of this course is to prepare MS-GH students for global health fieldwork. Students will develop critical skills, knowledge, and reflective insights to manage the multiple aspects of fieldwork. This course is a two-semester series of 0.5 credit in the fall and spring. This course is open only to first-year students in the MS-GH degree program. Consent of the Director of Graduate Studies at DGHI is required. Fall 2023/Spring 2024 – (30 enrolled); Fall 2025/Spring 2025 (34 enrolled)

GLHLTH 495s-1.01 Global Health Thesis (1credit)

This thesis preparation seminar accompanies the writing of a thesis for Graduation with Distinction in Global Health. The seminar reinforces the basics of research design (identifying appropriate research questions and related analyses), interpretation of results, writing skills and strategies, and oral presentation. Students are expected to work closely with their faculty mentor on their thesis. Registration for the course is restricted to students enrolled concurrently in a research independent study and seeking Graduation with Distinction. This course is a two-semester series of 0.5 credit in the fall and spring. Department consent required. Fall 2023/Spring 2024 – (4 enrolled)

MHCH 785: Decolonizing Maternal and Child Health Research: Theory and Qualitative Methods (3 credits)

This graduate seminar will provide Maternal and Child Health (MCH) students with an opportunity to examine key theories and qualitative methodologies that advance scholarship for reproductive health equity. Students will gain a deeper understanding of the intellectual foundations of research justice. They will learn to design research questions, data collection strategies, and analytic techniques that decolonize knowledge production. Fall 2022 – (30 enrolled); Fall 2021 – (24 enrolled, 10 audited)

MHCH 780 Cultural Humility (1 credit)

This is a 1 credit course in the 3-credit Professional Development Series for the Gillings MPH Global Health Concentration. This skills-oriented course covers topics related to applying cultural humility in global health research, practice, and advocacy. Fall 2022 – (31 enrolled); Fall 2021 – (48 enrolled); Spring 2021 – (31 enrolled); Spring 2020 - (26 enrolled)

MHCH 605 (12936): Survey Course on Breastfeeding and Public Health (3 credits)

This survey course covers principal topics in the broad field of human lactation and breastfeeding policy and practice, including domestic and global issues. Spring 2020 – (7 enrolled, 2 auditors); Spring 2018 – (9 enrolled, 1 auditor)
