Teaching responsibilities including continuing education:

Dr. Clements has precepted medical and PA students, and pediatric and psychiatry residents in the outpatient clinic each week. He gives lectures on infectious disease, immunology and epidemiology to medical students, PA students, residents and fellows, including grand rounds at Duke and UNC. Dr. Clements is the director of the Third Year Medical School Global Health track until 2021. He is the course director for a medical school course entitled "Exploring Medicine in Foreign Cultures" which has 20 hours of didactic education and a ten-day practicum in Honduras.
